Why?

- Equality is a fundamental value at our University

- Regulatory context: obligatory to create a Gender Equality Mission (Article L712-2 of the Education Code)

Gender-based and sexual violence - Seeking help

Emergency numbers for all of France

In the event of danger, **call**:

17 for the **police** and gendarmerie

15 for the **paramedics**

115 to leave a domestic violence situation and access emergency accommodation

112: unique European number to reach the emergency services

These emergency numbers are free and can be called from a landline or mobile, even one that is blocked or has no credit. They are accessible 24/7.

If **you cannot talk** or call safely:

send an **SMS** to **114** to talk to the **police**

make an **online report** to the police on <u>arretonslesviolences.gouv.fr</u>

If you are a victim of domestic violence, you can also report to the **police station**. At night, they are obliged to provide you with safety.
